Brother Chuck worked many years for the Boeing Company and retired in 1984. Chuck's greatest joy, besides his family, was his long and varied involvement in local and state fraternal organizations. Blalock Lodge #265, F&AM, Seattle Valley of Scottish Rite, a Life Member and Past Patron of Occidental Chapter #28, OES and Past Grand Patron of Washington serving with Catherine Mace, Worthy Grand Matron. Brother Chuck was also a Member of the Credentials Committee, General Grand Chapter, 1988-1991.
